

#### Item 1.01

#### Entry into a Material Definitive Agreement.

On April 13, 2010, International Isotopes Fluorine Products, Inc. ("<u>IIFP</u>"), a wholly owned subsidiary of International Isotopes Inc. (the "Company"), entered into a De-Conversion Services Agreement (the "Agreement") with Louisiana Energy Services, LLC ("LES"), pursuant to which IIFP will provide depleted uranium de-conversion services for URENCO USA (formerly known as the National Enrichment Facility), a gas centrifuge uranium enrichment plant being constructed five miles east of Eunice, New Mexico in Lea County. Pursuant to the Agreement, LES must provide certain minimum volumes of depleted material to IIFP for de-conversion. IIFP will convert the depleted uranium and dispose of the uranium oxide resulting from the de-conversion process for a fee, plus the cost of disposal at the time the depleted uranium is accepted by IIFP. IIFP will be responsible for all necessary transportation, security, emergency response and handling of the depleted uranium from LES's facility to IIFP's de-conversion facility, and will take title and assume liability with respect to such material upon such possession. The initial term of the Agreement extends for a period sufficient to cover five years of de-conversion services once IIFP's planned uranium de-conversion facility is operational, based on operations starting no later than December 31, 2013. The Agreement is conditioned, among other things, upon each party obtaining necessary third party and government approvals, LES obtaining the approval of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to the amendment of a provision in LES's materials license that prohibits shipments of depleted uranium to de-conversion facilities employing anhydrous hydrofluoric acid in the de-conversion process, and IIFP meeting certain performance milestones in the construction and start-up of the planned facility.

In connection with the Agreement, the Company executed a Parent Guarantee (the "Guarantee") pursuant to which the Company guarantees to LES and its affiliates, successors and assigns the full and timely performance by IIFP of its obligations under the Agreement.
